#### **Newsletter Summary:**

With its mission to promote community service and civic engagement, CALex (Chinese Americans of Lexington) has operated and executed greatly in the first half of 2019. Our highlighted achievements include the initiation of an educational seminar series, the hosting of a face-to-face candidate forum for local election, the organization of the 2019 Chinese New Year celebration and the participation of the Patriots' Day Parade and the Discovery Day Show. The special guests of 2019 Chinese New Year celebration include all three State Senators and Representatives of our district, the Chairs/Members of the Select Board and School Committee, the Superintendent, etc.

To better serve the community, CALex community members actively engaged in the elections of TMMs (Town Meeting Members), school PTOs/PTAs and Site Councils. We have set a record for the Chinese American Community in Lexington with three newly elected TMMs, PTO chairs of two schools, and four School Council Parent Representatives for the high school, middle schools and elementary schools. We also have members in PTO/PTA and School Redistricting Advisory Group.

CALex and the community members will continue to work together to serve the Lexington community in the second half of 2019 and beyond.

## May 25, 2019. CALex Joined Discovery Day:

The 40th Annual Discover Day, Lexington's long traditional street fair, was held on May 25 in perfect weather. Discovery Day is a great community event that offers people the opportunity to "discover" Lexington and to enjoy music and street performances. Among over 100 local businesses, organizations and municipal participants, CALex introduced itself, for the first time, to the large Lexington community.

CALex's booth 93 situated in the prime location right across from the performance stage and attracted a large number of visitors. The volunteers gave away small gifts including CALex balloons, Chinese traditional and kid bookmarks, cartoon prints. Visitors also had fun trying on the Han Chinese traditional costumes and taking pictures. Many people also stopped by to greet the volunteers, offer their help to the booth and express their appreciation of the work CALex has done for the Chinese-American community.


## May 08, 2019. Interested in Attending Peking University?

Eligibility criteria for international students include non-Chinese citizens; age between 18-25; SAT  $\geq$  1400 and HSK (Chinese Language Test) results  $\geq$  650.

Even to the organizers' surprise, the session attracted a large number of residents from Lexington and nearby towns.

#### March 17, 2019. CALex Educational Seminar 1: Overlooked Unique Issues in Chinese-American Children's Development

Ms. Shaobing Su, a Doctoral candidate from Tufts University, who specializes in Children Education, gave a seminar on unique issues, which are however often overlooked by parents, encountered by Chinese-American Children during their development.

Ms. Su elaborated on the challenges and opportunities of living in two very different cultures for the Chinese-American children. Ms. Su advocated for helping the children learn to appreciate and be proud of their Chinese heritage and build the confidence that the multi-cultural exposure does not diminish, but enriches their life experiences. The five C model of positive youth development, competence, confidence, connection, character and caring was introduced. And Ms. Su emphasized on connection and caring, two important elements that were traditionally not well appreciated by Chinese parents.

Finally, Ms. Su acknowledged the lack of research in this area and encouraged collaboration between parents and researchers. Ms. Su can be reached via WeChat ID: shaobingsu.

#### Feb 8 2019. Joyful Chinese New Year Celebration with Food and Entertainment

About three hundred people gathered to celebrate the Chinese Lunar New Year – the Year of the Pig. The second such celebration hosted by CALex. The celebration was also joined by State Senators Mike Barrett and Cindy Friedman, State Representative Michelle Ciccolo, Lexington Selectmen Suzie Barry (Chair) and Joe Pato, and School Committee Chair Eileen Jay and Superintendent Julie Hackett.

The event started with a potluck dinner for which the participants brought their own favorite dishes. A huge variety of dishes was shared. There were dumplings, Shanghainese soup (YanDuXian), Shichuan spicy dishes and Northern style cold noodles, to name a few, reflecting the diversity of the Chinese community in Lexington.

The participants also enjoyed wonderful entertainment, including folk dances, standup comedy, piano and classic Chinese rock songs, performed by Lexington residents and groups from the Greater Boston area. The folk dancing performance Love for Kang-Ba was one of the highlights of the night for its vivid costumes, artistic choreography and impeccable performance. CALex is planning to host the New Year celebration annually.

#### Feb 2, 2019. Town Election Candidate Forum Well Attended

To promote civic engagement of Chinese American community, CALex held a Candidates Forum at the Lexington Community Center, which was well attended. Four selectman candidates (Suzie Barry and Joe Pato for three-year term, Matthew Cohen and Mark Sandeen for one-year term and two Planning Board candidates (Nancy Corcoran-Ronchetti and Robert Peters) participated in the 2-hour forum.

The candidates conveyed their reasons for running, shared their relevant experience and answered questions from the Chinese American community. The candidates emphasized the importance of community involvement in town fairs. At the end of the forum, CALex encouraged fellow Chinese American to vote on March 4th and get their voices heard.

#### January 9, 2019. Cary Library Donation Exceeding Goal

To celebrate the 150th birthday of the Cary Library, CALex raised donations totaled of \$4,553.63, greatly exceeding the \$3,000 fundraising goal. The donations came from Lexington Chinese American community including several small businesses, showcasing the generosity of the community and the love and appreciation from the community for our wonderful Cary Library.
